About Guatemala

Population: Approximately 17.11 Million

Political Status: Guatemala signed a peace treaty in 1996. Since then there has been no uprising and is one of the most stable of the third world countries in the western hemisphere.

The region that we will be working in is the region of Zacapa which can be found on the map. The region is very dry and arid, and temperatures can get extremely warm which leaves us taking shifts to work to not over exert ourselves.


<u>Who:</u>

<u>What are we doing?</u> We will be building a home for a family living in Pueblo Modelo, Guatemala, and visiting the ministries that Hearts in Motion supports, including a senior citizens center, nutrition center, clinics, and much more!

Where: We will be spending most of our time in the region of Zacapa but will spend the last two days of the trip in the city of Antigua. You will have electricity, private bathrooms, and access to clean water at both places.

When we are serving, we will be staying in the Hearts In Motion House located in Teculutan, Guatemala. The Hearts in Motion house has a/c in the rooms.

WHAT WOULD I NEED FOR THE TRIP?

Your Passport:

The passport process:

- 1. Get Pictures taken for the Passport from Walgreens, AAA, etc.
- 2. Fill out the Required forms and turn into the Post Office or Courthouse (Be sure to bring two checks and both guardians must be present)
- 3. They will take it from here and send you your passport.

Note: this must be done soon to make sure you get it back in time. It can take up to 2-3 months turn around for you to get your passport back.

Immunizations:

The following Immunizations are

r**ecommended** for those traveling to Guatemala by the US government:

- 1. Typhoid-shot 2.
- 2. Hepatitis A-shot
- 3. Hepatitis B-shot
- 4. Tetanus-Diphtheria
- 5. Malaria (pills taken before, during and after trip)
- 6. COVID-19– This is currently **RECOMMENDED** by Hearts in Motion to travel with them on this trip.

-Ask your doctor or the local travel clinic for medications or immunizations



OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Trip Rules and Expectaions

Our number one goal on the trip is keeping all youth and adults safe while they are traveling. To help ensure, this, we ask all to follow the rules below.

-No one (youth or leaders) on a youth trip is allowed to consume alcoholic products or use tobacco products including vaping while on the trip.

-No student is allowed in the bedroom of the opposite gender

-Students are never allowed to leave the hotel/house without an adult present

-Dress Code: We want everyone to be comfortable while on the trip. While on the trip, we ask that all students wear shirts with sleeves (tshirts are fine) and longer shorts. If you are working with concrete, you will want jeans or long pants to work in as the concrete can get in your pores.

Costs for the Trip

Major Costs:

-\$1,250 to paid to HIM (includes all in country transportation, lodging and most meals while on the trip) -Airplane Ticket

Other Costs:

- -\$165 for Passport
- -\$16.99 for Passport Photo
- -Cost of Immunizations Varies
- -Spending Money (\$200 is enough)
- -Money for 4 meals in Antigua and your travel days

All money and paperwork will need to be turned into -An online Registration for HIM (parents will fill out for youth) -A youth or adult code of conduct signed
